The Spirit of Truth Bears Witness to Jesus

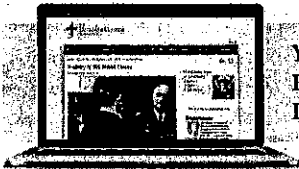
- 1 Lord Jesus Christ, You have prepared
