Dear Friends and Coheirs with Christ,

We are restricted in how we worship, yet we know God's word is not restricted. It has free course and accomplishes the purposes for which it is sent. It is the desire of the Elders and me to ensure that God's gifts of Word and Supper are available to all who desire them. This letter is to ensure people have opportunity to hear the service and also to explain how communion will be handled on Easter.

First, if you are unable to watch the services on the internet or on Spectrum (channel 181), we can provide you with a DVD or CD. Your elder likely has discussed this with you. If not, please call the office and tell us how we can provide for you the service. (402) 462-9023.

Second, after the 9 am Easter service on the 12th, we will be offering Holy Communion every half hour beginning at 10:30 and ending at 2. The service of Holy Communion takes less than 15 minutes which allows 15 minutes to sanitize and prepare for the next Communion. So as to minimize the chances of spreading germs we ask that all who arrive early, wait in their car until five minutes before their scheduled time. The doors will stand open and bulletins will be laid out to minimize surfaces that are touched. We ask that those able to stand meet in front of the communion rail where we will begin the service. You can sign up for a time at the signupgenius page that has already been created. If you cannot sign up online, call the office. Note that we ask you to fill in the earlier time slots before moving to the later ones.

Also, we ask that those who are at risk for COVID-19 exercise caution in making their decision. However, as I've said earlier, every Christian is free to make the decision for themselves. We also ask that anyone showing symptoms of cold or flu refrain from coming at this time. If someone has concerns, they should not feel obligated to come. Communion is a gift which is good whenever it is received.

Finally, I want to remind people that I have a Facebook page where you can get updates and be part of an instant messenger group.
