Dear Holy Ones of God,

Grace and peace to you in Christ, our Good Shepherd, who walks with us through the valley of the shadow of death.

As you have likely heard, the Directed Health Measures in Nebraska are scheduled to allow churches to gather after May 4<sup>th</sup>. We are planning to return to corporate worship on May 10<sup>th</sup>. While we are awaiting the Governor's guidelines, the elders and I thought it good to communicate our preliminary plans for a safe return to worship. To be sure this is subject to change as we learn more. We will make a video available that illustrates our plans. Here they are in brief:

1. Upon entering the church, you will be ushered to an available seat to ensure 6 feet of separation between family units.
2. You will find offering baskets and bulletins in the narthex. We will not be passing offering plates. (Hymnals and fellowship pads will be removed.)
3. For communion we will not kneel at the rail. There will be three stations where the pastor and elders will offer the host and the chalice or individual cups. The communicants will walk to each station after being directed by the elder to ensure 6 foot of space. Especially for those communing from the chalice, please note we will use fortified wine with a higher alcohol content. Also we will wipe the rim with a cloth soaked in pure grain alcohol. You will approach the altar from the side aisle and return to your pew via the center aisle. The pastor and elders will wash their hands well before communion and will use hand sanitizer.
4. After the service, we will dismiss each pew. Please do not congregate inside the church, but move to the outside after you've been dismissed.
5. After church, we will have a cleaning team wipe down surfaces with suggested cleaning supplies.

**Please Note** if you are at a higher risk for complications, we encourage you to stay home. We will continue to live stream the service, and to provide DVD's for those without Internet or cable access. **Also, if you show any signs of sickness, we ask you to stay home.
